Flag replaced

Veterans of Foreign Wars Brotherhood-Farmington Hills Post 2269 and its auxiliary chose Veterans Day to make a gift of an American flag to Farmington Nursing Home. The flag was presented to Joe Fink, a resident in the home, by representatives of the post.

The home had lost two American flags that flew from a pole close to Fink's window in short succession this summer. The flags were a source of pleasure to Fink and both were given to the home at his request.

While Farmington Nursing Home residents and staff were mystified by the losses, Irene Radebaugh, speaking for the VFW, was not.

"It is just not that unusual. We lost four of five of them," Radebaugh said of the flags that flew from the grounds of the post home on Orchard Lake Road. "We did find a way to secure it, with the help of Farmington Hills Fire Department. It can never be flown at half-mast now, and we get some funny comments about that, but we still have our flag."

The new flag at Farmington Nursing Home will be secured in the same manner, Radebaugh said.

"I'm sure Joe is the most patriotic resident we have here," said Carolyn Darling, a staff member of the home. "He makes it a practice to go outside and salute the flag every morning."

Fink is a native of Russia who served overseas with the 4th Division of the U.S. Army in World War I.

Guests at the short ceremony and party arranged by the staff for Fink said he was particularly pleased that the VFW brought pamphlets of Flag Etiquette to pass out to those who attended the flag presentation.

Basics of drug use told in free program

The physical effects of cocaine and marijuana will be discussed at 7 p.m. Tuesday, Dec. 2, in Brighton Hospital.

Two members of the treatment center's clinical staff will present an overview of how these two drugs affect the human body and explain how patients who use the drugs can be helped.

"We have been receiving many calls from concerned family members, educators and employers who need some basic information on cocaine, marijuana, alcohol and other drugs," said Ivan C. Harner, Brighton Hospital's president. "We developed this education series to help people learn how substance abuse problems can be prevented and treated. The Dec. 2 program covers a topic that many people are especially concerned about."

The Community Education Program takes place on the first Tuesday evening of each month. The series is free and open to the public. Reservations are not required.
