

# police/fire calls

Listed are some of the Farmington-area police and fire calls received during the past week:

## • CLOTHING RECOVERED

Two 17-year-olds from Southfield face felony charges after they allegedly broke out the window of a car parked at the 12th Estate Condos at 11:30 p.m. Nov. 28 and stole two bags of clothing valued at \$200.

Special Patrol Operational Team officers had the area under surveillance at the time. The two teenagers were arrested nearby, soon after officers confirmed the car had been broken into. Clothing believed stolen from the parked car was found inside the teens' car, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

Arraigned Nov. 29 before District Judge Margaret Schaeffer of Farmington, the teens stood mute to single counts of breaking and entering of an automobile, punishable upon conviction by up to five years in prison or a \$1,000 fine.

The teens were released on \$1,000 personal bond pending a preliminary examination in 47th District Court.

## • ARMED ROBBERY

An employee of the self-serve Amoco station at Nine Mile and Farmington roads was robbed at knifepoint Nov. 30, according to a Farmington Department of Public Safety report.

According to the report, a man entered the station at 3:30 p.m. and took \$230 from the register after verbally threatening the employee, then pulling an 8-inch knife from his pocket. Other armed robberies with knives have occurred recently in Southfield, Livonia, Dearborn and Fraser.

## • ATTIC FIRE

An attic fire at 6:30 a.m. Nov. 28 at a house on W. King William caused \$5,500 in structural damage, investigators said.

An electrical short-circuit caused the fire, confined to the attic in the two-story house, Farmington Hills Fire Chief Richard Marinucci said.

## • GIRL FREED

Farmington Hills firefighters dismantled and cut away part of a kid's die ride to free a 4-year-old girl whose arm and hand became stuck in the kangaroo at Tally Hall, 31985 Orchard Lake, Nov. 30.

The girl was taken to Botsford for treatment, Farmington Hills Fire Chief Richard Marinucci said.

## • COMPUTER TAKEN

An Apple computer system valued at \$1,000 was reported stolen from a classroom at Farmington High School, 32000 Shawwassee, over the Thanksgiving holiday weekend, according to a Farmington Department of Public Safety report.

According to the report, someone entered the building without tripping the alarms, removed molding and glass from the classroom door, then unlocked the door to gain entry. The computer system, which included two disc drives and a keyboard, was taken from a desk in the room.




