Agenda details for selected government meetings scheduled for this week follow. All meetings are open to the public.

**Farmington Hills City Council

A public hearing has been scheduled to determine whether to proceed with sanitary sewers on Kirby and a portion of Cass, between Rhonswood to Edmonston in Farmington Acres subdivision.

A proposed group home on Grayling for mentally ill adults is expected to be discussed. Council will also consider enacting a zoning amendment for property on the west side of Orchard Lake Road, between Woodward and Ravine, from RA-1 to OS-1. Also to be considered are open space development rights under the Farm Land and Open Space Preservation Act for the Farmington Hills Country Club.

Council will be asked to authorize a notice of intent to issue \$7 million in general obligation bonds to finance a major road improvement program.

Also to be considered for approval is participation in the 1987 Oakland County Tri-Party Road Improvement Program and a new agreement between the city and the International Association of Fire Fighters Local 2659.

Council will consider increasing engineering inspection rates, adoption of a resolution supporting the widening of Orchard Lake Road, 11 Mile to Grand River and the purchase of new vehicles for the police, fire and finance departments.

Council will receive a report on the 1987 road construction program

and drainage problems on Goldsmith. Also to be considered is adoption of the master storm drain plan.

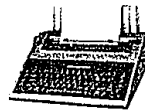

WHEN IS THE RIGHT TIME FOR SURGERY?

One of the outstanding advances in medicine is the development of successful artificial hand joint, hip, and knee replacements. There are metal alloys that resist fatigue, epoxy resins that bind metal to bone, and surgical techniques which allow precise alignment of artificial joints to the underlying bone.

Yet many people who are taking arthritis medication, continue to walk in pain. Why not cure their problem through surgical replacement of the involved joint?

The reasons why surgery is not always the answer includes: First, surgery is dangerous; any time a person goes under general anesthesia there is a risk of death or brain injury. Second, surgery can fall and leave the individual with more difficulties than were present before the operation. Third, surgery can be accompanied by infection; then the person will have two major problems rather than one.

The right time for surgery is when the individual, because of constant and intense pain, can no longer undertake self care or sleep. Until the arthritic patient reaches that point, medications, heat, injection, and rest are methods of care.
