Feldman is a state-licensed "group day care home" operator who cares for between five and seven preschool children in her house cach day. She has followed state guldelines for the past four years in operating her baby-sitting service, according to Hilds Weems, a supervisor for the Michigan Department of Social Services in the Oakland County area. The DSS is responsible for licensing child care throughout the state.

People watching children in their homes are supposed to be licensed through the state, according to Weems. Feldman is licensed as a "group day care home" and is al-lowed to watch up to 12 children. She must have a second caregiver, which she does, 35 square feet of play space per child in the house and a fire extinguisher.

Less restrictive, but still requiring a license, is a "family day care home" which allows care of up to six children. Most of the state-registered people in Oakland County have the family day care home licenses.

TO RECEIVE such a license, an operator goes through a three-hour orientation, provides references for the state, goes through a three-hour orientation, provides references for the state, goes through a critinial and protective services check and must prove they have no communicable diseases, Weems sald.

Neither the group or family day care home should be confused with the traditional day care "center" rules required by the state, according to Weems, which usually encompass commercial day care centers and include some of the local day care groups located in the area.
