

police/fire calls

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police and fire calls received during the past week.

● SHOPPER ROBBED

A man and a woman took a \$5,000 beaver coat, a \$2,000 pair of diamond earrings and a \$300 Gucci watch from a 32-year-old Farmington Hills woman in the parking lot at Summit Place Mall in Waterford Township Dec. 11.

The coat was ripped from the woman's back, the earrings were ripped from her car lobes and the watch was ripped from her wrist. Her purse, containing \$300 in cash, also was taken in the robbery, Waterford Township police said.

The woman was treated at the scene by paramedics. The woman told police she was walking to her car — in the east lot outside Hudson's — at 7:30 p.m. when a man, wielding a long-bladed knife, and a female companion approached from

behind and demanded her fur coat and purse.

She gave up her purse but when she wouldn't hand over the full-length coat, she was knocked to the ground. That's when her coat, earrings and watch were forcibly taken.

The thieves, who appeared to be in their late 20s, then ran toward the main entrance to the mall, at Elizabeth Lake and Telegraph roads.

The stolen property was valued at \$7,600, the woman told police.

● 2 CHARGED

Two Redford Township teen-agers face felony charges after a BB gun was fired at a car occupied by two Northville men Dec. 8.

Arrested Dec. 9 before Magistrate James Brady of Farmington, the two Redford men stood mute to felony charges.

The driver was charged with carrying a dangerous weapon (a dagger and a sheath) in a vehicle, punishable upon conviction by up to five years

in prison and a \$2,500 fine. The passenger was charged with felonious assault, punishable upon conviction by up to four years in prison and a \$2,000 fine.

Innocent pleas were entered in the defendants' behalf. They were released on \$1,000 bond pending a preliminary examination in 47th District Court.

According to Farmington Hills Special Patrol Operational Team officer Wayne Beerbower, who saw the incident, a shot from a long-barreled gun was fired into the driver's window of a pickup truck. The occupants of both the truck and a car argued while stopped at a traffic light on northbound Orchard Lake Road at I-96 shortly before midnight. SPOT officers arrested the two suspects soon after on St. Mary in Farmington. Two BB guns were found in the car. A dagger and a sheath were found in the glovebox.

● HOUSE FIRE

Damage was estimated at \$38,000

from a house fire on Dunkirk at 6 a.m. Dec. 9. When firefighters arrived, they found flames in the living room and a storage area.

The cause continues to be investigated, according to a Farmington Hills Fire Department report.

● FORGED PRESCRIPTION

A woman thought to be in her 30s tried to pass a forged prescription at Perry Drugs, 33330 12 Mile, Dec. 10. The handwritten "prescription" was rejected when the pharmacist noticed the wrong Drug Enforcement Administration number for the desired drug, Percodan. A call to the supposed issuing physician revealed that he not only types his prescriptions, but also never prescribes Percodan, according to a Farmington Hills police report.
