WOMAN ROBBED

A 62-year-old woman was robbed of her purse and its contents and jewelry — together valued at \$600 — after parking her car in a garage at Hunters Ridge Apartments Dec. 17.

According to a Farmington Hills police report:

The woman closed the overhead bay door after driving into the garage at 8:30 p.m. After getting out of her car, she noticed a man standing near the walk-in door.

She then got back into her car but before she could close the driver's door, two young men, who appeared to be 15-17, entered the garage and approached her. One grabbed the driver's door and demanded her purse. Noticing it in the car seat, she reached past her to get it. He also took two bracelets and a ring before the two left. The woman was not hurt.

Cocaine possession alleged

A Yugoslav citizen living in Farmington Hills is one of six people who federal investigators have identified as part of an alleged drug smuggling ring. A criminal complaint was filed Dec. 11 in U.S. District Court charging Avdo Djokovic — an unemployed painter — with possession with intent to distribute cocaine. A court date will be set to accept his plea.

U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration agents arrested Djokovic along with a 42-year-old Colombian citizen living illegally in Miami

and a 43-year-old Miami restaurant owner Dec. 10 in Southfield. All were charged with the same offense, FBI Special Agent Robert Mott said.

Bella Djokovic, 23, unemployed and living with his brother in Farmington Hills, was arrested along with a 25-year-old unemployed Hamtramck woman Dec. 15 in Detroit. Bella is charged with possession with intent to deliver heroin. A court date will be set to accept his plea.

A 30-year-old Yugoslavian was arrested Dec. 15 at Djokovic's

Farmington Hills home. The Immigration and Naturalization Service has started deportation proceedings against the unemployed man, saying he is an illegal alien.

The 18-month investigation — a joint effort of the FBI, DEA, and INS — has netted 8½ pounds of cocaine and three ounces of heroin, Mott said.

The drugs have a wholesale value of \$400,000.

"The street value would be 25 to 50 times that, depending on how small they were broken down into for sale," Mott said.
