A total of 1,085 lineal feet of road edge drain will be installed, as appared by the step of the s

edge drain will be installed, as ap-proved by city council Dec. 15, in front of Farmington High School on awassee, and on Shiawassee cast Warner in an area on Farmington.

Expected to cost \$14,650, the edge drain is expected to dry out the affected areas of roadway, allowing less costly measures to be used next spring when road work is planned, officials said.
