## Hepatitis patients called for study conducted at WSU

Wayne State University School of Medicine, in cooperation with the National Inclutives of Health and the Food and Drug Administration, has initiated a clinical trial using thymus gland hormones in the treatment of chronic active hepatilis resulting from infection with the hepatilis B winus.

This clinical trial is of particular This clinical trial is of particular importance in that it offers a potential form of therapy for a disease where no current accepted therapy is available. Caronic active hepatitis B is a disease that provokes considerable anxiety since it can progress to cirrobasis of the liver, the formation of liver cancer and, in a number of patients, can result in liver failure and death.

Thymic hormone treatment for chronic active hepatilis B has been evaluated in the People's Republic of Chica, West Germany and Poland. The results of these various therapeutic trials have been very promising with a significant proportion of the patients demonstrating improvement with thymic hormone treatments.

The clinical trial conducted by Wayne State University will extend for a period of three years, and it is anticipated that 30 individuals with chronic active hepatitis B will be treated.

Preliminary results from the current studies indicate that beneficial effects have been seen in patients with chronic active hepatitis B treated with the thymic bormone. Individuals who have chronic active hepatitis due to the hepatitis B virus are encouraged to contact their physician for referral to the medical school studies or may directly contact the program directors at Wayne State University.

The principal investigator coordinating these studies is Dr. Milton Mutchnick, Chief of Gastroenterology, Hutzel Hospital, Associate Professor of Medicine at Wayne State University School of Medicine. The telephone number is 745-7521. There will be no charge to individuals accepted into the study as costs are covered by a federal grant.
