All of the Lung Association's activities carry with them the goal of eradicating lung disease and most importantly educating the public about respiratory aliments and their causes.

One of the largest battles being waged against lung disease is that of smoking. Smoking is the single, most preventable cause of premature death and disability in the country and about 30,000 Americans will die this year from smoking-related diseases.
