### ● ICE SCULPTURE

The annual ice sculpture event in Plymouth is waiting for you. The tour will leave Farmington Hills City Hall at 11:30 a.m. and travel to the Hillside Inn for a lunch of stuffed, bonnie breast of chicken with Marsala wine sauce, rice pilaf, bread basket and beverage. With the conclusion of lunch, you can observe the abundant and beautiful sculptures carved from ice in downtown Plymouth. Fee is \$14 per person and includes lunch and transportation.
