Gregory and Scott, two of the most exceptional baskethall players produced by Bishop Borgess, matched up against each other. Scott, the point guard for EMU, against Gregory, the point guard for Bowling Green. For the first time in a college game, Gregory and Scott matched up man on man.

THE OUTCOME, from Gregory's perspective, was disastrors. EMU humiliated Bowling Green 95-52.
"This hart's, Gregory said after the game, "This harts real bad." Said Stott: "Playing against one of my high school teammates, I was definitely pumped up. And you know there was no way I wanted to lose

Actually, the individual haitle between Gregory and Scott — though difficult to measure because of the team's differing offensive philosophies — was pretily even.

Scott, slowed some by a flu virus, played 23 minutes. He made two of three shots for four points, grabbed two rebounds and dished out two assirts. He also made a steal (off Gregory). In fact, Scott's and EMU's bounding man-to-man delense was the difference in the game. The badgered Falcons hit on just 19 of 60

Gregory played 28 minutes. He hit two of four shots and one of two free throws for five points. He had a re-hound, four assists and two steals

bound, four assists and two steals (one off Sout). It should be pointed out that Sout is 6-5 and Gregory 5-9. But where Sout had the advantage of height and reach, Gregory had an edge in quickness. It made for an intriguing individual battle, a welcomed one considering the one-sidedness of the same.

For Scott and Gregory, Wedney and Gregory was a sophomore in 1933 when Scott, a senior, was establishing most of the Bishop Borges scoring records. Two years later, Gregory had eclipsed all of Scott's records. The two players still get together over the summer and play pickup games at Borgess.

After seeing limited action as a freahman, Scott was asked to play small forward as a sophomore. He responded by averaging 8.8 points and 4.5 rebonds per game, and of the play shouling guard. Prior to Wednesday night, he has averaged 13 points and three rebounds per game. In 11 games he has 56 assists and 22 turnovers.
