A weekend workshop, "Our Voices: Our Values: How to Speak Out for Nuclear Disarmament," will run from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday and from 9 a.m. to noon Sunday, Jan. 17, 18 in First Presbyterian Church of Birmingham, 1669 Maple.

The event is sponsored by Metro Detroit WAND (Women's Action for Nuclear Disarmament). Ginger Owens, an Ann Arbor resident and a

trainer for the national organization, will lead the sessions.

"For the many people who care deeply about this issue, expressing their concerns is very difficult," said Patricia Dines, co-chairwoman of the event. "This program is planned to help more people raise their voices so that we can make the world safe for future generations."

The training has been developed by national WAND.

"Participants will learn facts and figures about the arms race and work on personal barriers to speaking comfortably and effectively whether it be publicly or among friends and colleagues," said Harriet Alpern, who is Dines's co-chairwoman. "The people who go through

our workshop come out feeling more hopeful that they can make a difference toward peace."

Displaced Homemakers program continues

Through a grant from the Michigan Department of Labor, Office of Women and Work, Jewish Vocational Service and Community Workshop, a non-sectarian agency, announces the sixth year of a Displaced Homemaker Program for individuals from Wayne and Oakland Counties.

Displaced homemakers are women who, through divorce, separation,

widowhood or disability of spouse, have lost their source of economic support. After spending a substantial number of years in the home caring for family members, displaced homemakers find returning to the job market a difficult transition.

The on-going program offers vocational assessment, vocational counseling, job seeking skills and job

placement assistance. Women who need to become financially self-sufficient, who need help in entering the job market after many years in the home, are invited to apply to Jewish Vocational Service and Community Workshop.

Eligibility is based on marital and employment status. There are no income guidelines.
