The seventh annual Greater Detroit Gem and Mineral Show will be held in the Detroit Light Guard Armory, 4400 E. Eight Mile Rd. (between Ryan and Mound), Friday, Saturday and Sunday, Oct. 23, 24 and 25.

The show will be open from 6 to 10 p.m. Friday, 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturday, and 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Sunday. The show, which is competitive and non-competitive, is sponsored by the Michigan Mineralogical Society. Exhibits will include crystals, polished minerals, rocks, paintings, carved stones and carved snuff boxes, cut gems, jewelry, fossils, Indian artifacts, silver handcraft work, lapidary, faceting, semi-precious stones, opal crosses, White Pine mine and its minerals.

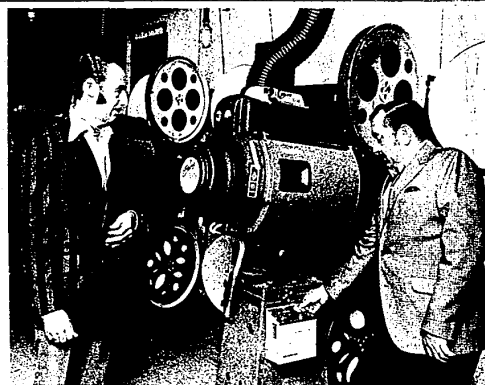
Farmington Players Complete Casting

Projection Change Is Automatic

The Quo Vadis Entertainment Center in Westland has scored a first in the area by installing automated projection machines in its four-theater operation.

Eight projection machines serve Quo Vadis Theaters I and II and Quo Vadis Penthouse Theaters I and II. Automation now means that, using 5,000 foot reels, changes are required every 35 minutes and are done automatically.

Under the old system, 2,000 foot film reels required a change to another projector every 18 minutes. This was done manually.

The automated system also starts the pre-show music, turns up the house lights, and at designated show-time starts the projectors, turns off pre-show music, dims the house lights, opens the curtains.

lights the projector lamps and turns on sound. The automated projection lamps no longer use carbon, but instead use xenon bulbs exclusively. These create a non-flickering light which provides a steadier picture performance.

The two automated booths are supervised continually by two projectionists, Darryl Kavel, who looks after the Quo Vadis Penthouse I and II, and Herb Strong, chief projectionist, who supervises Quo Vadis I and II.

The Quo Vadis' four theaters are all under one roof, opposite the Westland Shopping Center on Wayne Rd.
