



### Snow Show Now Open At Armory

Snowmobiling enthusiasts will have an opportunity to view just about every kind of snowmobile sold in Michigan at the Big Snow Show, the third Greater Michigan Snowmobile and Winter Sports Show.

The show got under way Saturday, Oct. 17, and runs through Oct. 25 in the Detroit Artillery Armory, 15000 W. Eight Mile, Oak Park. Hours are weekdays from 5 to 11 p.m., Saturdays from noon to 11 p.m. and Sundays from noon to 9 p.m. Admission is \$2 for adults and 50 cents for children.

The public will be invited to take part in a "count the snowballs" contest. The person who comes closest to estimating the number of "snowballs" in a giant "ice-cube" will win a snowmobile and related gear. Besides what's new in snowmobiles, fans can learn about snowmobile clubs and see new designs in snowmobile clothing.
