Raiders claim city title

North Farmington proved it had the best wrestling team in the city Thursday, knocking off both Farmington Harrison and Farmington in the annual city tournament.

North beat Farmington 45-21 and Harrison 72-6. Farmington beat Harrison 69-6. Both Farmington and Harrison lost to Walled Lake Western, the fourth combatant in the quadrangular meet. North and Western didn't wrestle.

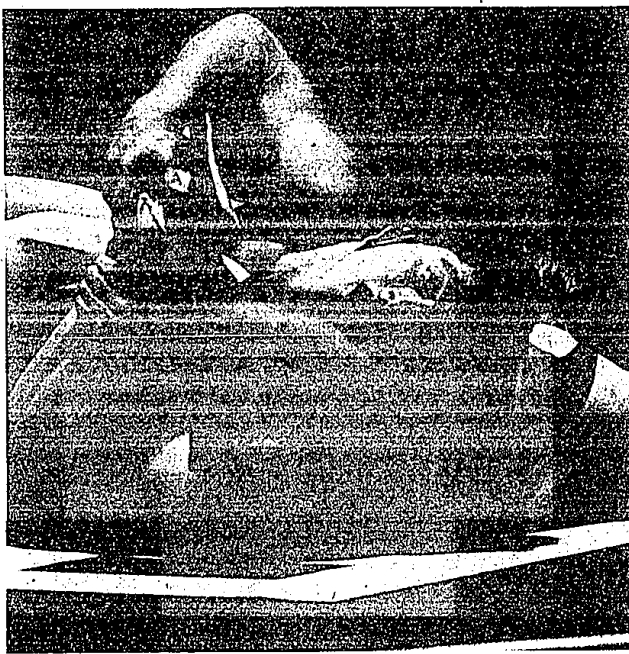
Seven North Farmington wrestlers went unbeaten in the two matches: Paul Cook (145 pounds), Dave Appel (112), Bill Marley (126), Mark Cassar (155), Dan Starra (185), Zaim Cumula (198) and Ian Scherbin (heavyweight).

The Raiders are 5-9 on the season.

Farmington, whose victory against Harrison was its second in 14 dual meets, got three wins each from Rich Woodbeck (132) and Bill Lindbert (167). Woodbeck is 21-6 on the season for the Falcons and Lindbert is 16-8.

T.J. Armstrong (119), Todd Jacobs (126) and Gary Blair (145-155) were all 2-1 on the day.

All 12 of Harrison's city tournament points were scored by Cliff Alcantara. The 105-pounder pinned both of his opponents.

Division champs: Canton, Salem

Plymouth Salem and Plymouth Canton rule the Western Lakes wrestling scene.

The two Centennial Educational Park teams clinched their respective division titles Thursday night. Salem beat Westland John Glenn 41-21 to clinch the Lakes Division. Canton edged Northville 34-32 to wrap up the Western Division title.

"The kids felt real good about it," said Canton coach Rick Menoche, whose team is 9-2 on the season losing to Salem and Glenn.

"And we feel real good about things going into the league meet (Saturday at Glenn). We're going to screw things up at the league meet for a lot of people."

Salem has yet to lose a Lakes Division title in the five-year history of the Western Lakes. Nor have

the Rocks lost a conference title in the Western Lakes.

"It used to be that we would gear our season to the state meet," said Rocks coach Ron Krueger. "We figured if we did that, everything else would fall into place. Now this league meet thing is getting real scary. There is a lot more balance throughout the league than there used to be. It used to be that a couple of teams could place their whole team at the league meet. Those days are long gone I'm afraid."

THE ROCKS got some unexpected victories to help them defeat Glenn. Heavyweight Richard Johnson had never beaten Glenn's Chris Zimmerman. On Thursday, Johnson won 7-1. At 198, Chuck Graczyk had never won a match against Glenn. He beat his man Thursday 7-5.

Salem also got a big win from Lam Yeung at 155. Yeung trailed Derek Tharp 7-4 with time running out in the match. But, at the 5:18 mark, Yeung pinned Tharp. Todd Bourlier (105), Dave Mang

(112) and Tim Ott (132) scored pins for Salem. Jeff Delbecke (98), Dennis Dameron (126) and Bill Atwell (138) won on decision. The Rocks are 9-0 in the Western Lakes and 10-2 overall.

CANTON CLAIMED eight of the 13 matches against Northville, but all of the Mustang victories were pins.

Dan Dryer (167) and Jim Crews (198) picked up Canton's lone pins. Tom Flores (98), Matt Keeler (105), Craig Rinke (132), Nick Purzer (138) and Mark Wasiak (155) won on decision. Heavyweight Tony Callaway won on a void.

Salem and Glenn will be the favored teams entering Saturday's conference meet.

Mercy's skiers upend Brighton

The Farmington Hills Mercy ski team has two blemishes on its record this season — a second-place finish in a giant slalom meet and a dual meet loss. Both were administered by Brighton.

The Marlins avenged one of the blemishes Wednesday at Mount Brighton.

For the first time ever, the Marlins won a giant slalom race against Brighton. Mercy outpointed the Bulldogs 19-23 in a six-team race. East

Lansing (48), Birmingham Seaholm (74), Southfield-Lathrup (87) and Birmingham Groves (94) rounded out the pack.

Lexi Davis (41.21 combined time) and Leigh Clancy (41.59) placed 1-2 for the Marlins. Kelly Garbin was sixth (2:57) and Beth McIntosh (44:57) was 10th.

The next time Brighton and Mercy will clash will be at the regional meet Feb. 19.

Plymouth Salem lost its first two gymnastics meets and the cynics were ready to bury the team.

Don't look now, but the Rocks are beginning to look like league challengers again. They won their second straight Western Lakes meet Thursday, 128.7-115.55 at Farmington.

Jackie Huff and Becky Talbot were the top scorers in the meet. Huff scored 32.4 all-around and Talbot 32.3. Jackie Daly led Farmington with a 31.75 total.

Daly won the vault (9.15) and shared first on balance beam with Salem's Sharon Way, each scoring 8.4.

Huff won the floor exercise (8.7), placed second on vault (8.5) and third on beam (8.2).

Talbot won uneven parallel bars (8.65) and placed second on floor (8.45).

Dana Holda had a solid meet for the Rocks. She was third on vault (8.4), third on bars (8.1) and tied for third on floor with Farmington's Amy Frontier (7.5). Jenny Sylla contributed a second on beam for the Rocks (8.3).

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that a special election will be held in Farmington Public School District, County of Oakland and State of Michigan, on Tuesday, the 10th day of February, 1987, for the purpose of submitting the following proposition:
