

**police/fire calls**

**Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police and fire calls received during the past week.**

**● ASSAULT ALLEGED**  
A 51-year-old Detroit man is charged with assault with intent to commit murder. He is being charged in connection with an attack on his ex-girlfriend. The incident happened along I-696 near I-375 in Farmington Hills.

District Judge Michael Hand of Farmington signed a warrant for Ralph Sallee's arrest Feb. 2. Sallee remained at large as of Friday.

**● GARAGE BURNS**  
Two 12-year-old boys and one 13-year-old boy ignited a homemade Molotov cocktail that caused \$12,000 in damage to a garage and a neighboring house Wednesday afternoon in Farmington Hills.

No one was injured in the fire, which broke out at 5:30 p.m. in a detached garage on Jefferson.

The boys made a Molotov cocktail using directions from a manual. Apparently, they didn't think it would burn because the wick was yarn. But when lit, the device ignited. The boys tried to extinguish the flames with carpets and blankets but they quickly spread, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

The fire spread to a car parked in the driveway and a neighboring house. No one was home at the time.

**● ASSAULT ALLEGED**  
A 17-year-old Harrison High School student was arraigned Friday before District Judge Michael Hand of Farmington on one count of assault and battery and a second count of loitering on school property. The misdemeanors carry penalties upon conviction of up to 90 days in jail.

The suspect stood mute and an innocent plea was entered in his behalf. He was released on \$200 personal bond, according to Commander Michael Wigginis of the Farmington Department of Public Safety.

The charge revolved around the Feb. 5 assault of a 15-year-old female student.

One hour before the alleged assault, District Judge Margaret Schaeffer sentenced the man to a 10-day suspended jail sentence and six months' probation, and fined him \$105, for loitering at Farmington High School.

A hearing will be set on the probation violation, Wigginis added.

**● UNEXPECTED RETURN**  
A disgruntled customer drove his 1983 Dodge pickup truck into the showroom window at Town & Country Dodge, 31015 Grand River, Feb. 5.

The 33-year-old Redford Township man told officers he was returning the truck to Chrysler because of chronic problems.

"This is the only way that I can get some attention," he told officers, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

A warrant was issued charging the man with malicious destruction of a building over \$100, punishable upon conviction by up to four years in jail and a \$2,000 fine.

Damage was estimated at \$1,000.

**● TEEN SENTENCED**  
A 17-year-old Farmington Hills resident who twice violated sentences of probation for loitering on school property was sentenced to three concurrent 90-day sentences in the Oakland County Jail following his arrest for a similar offense Feb. 4.

The teenager and a 16-year-old

Harrison High student allegedly were involved in a fight over money at 11 a.m. Feb. 4 on the school patio. The fight broke up when school administrators approached, but arrangements were set to resume, with reinforcements, at 2:15 p.m. in the parking lot, said Sgt. Charles Nebus of the Farmington Hills Police Department.

At 2:15, marked and unmarked police officers blocked the exit to Harrison. That's when the 17-year-old was arrested for loitering. He previously was warned to not loiter on school property, Nebus said.

Appearing before District Judge Margaret Schaeffer of Farmington, the teenager pleaded guilty to one count of loitering on school property and two counts of probation violation. That backdrop, plus the prior warnings against loitering, influenced the judge's tough sentencing, Nebus said.

Another 17-year-old Farmington Hills resident — not a Harrison student and previously warned to not loiter on school property — also was arrested in the Harrison lot. He was present during the earlier fight, but not involved, Nebus said. He was released on \$50 bond pending arraignment.

The maximum penalty for loitering on school property is 90 days in jail and a \$500 fine.

**● TEENS TICKETED**  
Three Farmington Hills teenagers were ticketed for possessing alcohol in a car at Harrison High School, 29995 12 Mile, at 8:15 p.m. Feb. 4.

Officers found beer in the car. Two teens were 17, the other, 18, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

**● DAMAGE REPORTED**  
Damage was estimated at \$250 when a car parked on Mirlolin was vandalized between Jan. 22 and Feb. 2.

**Aides help seniors complete income tax**

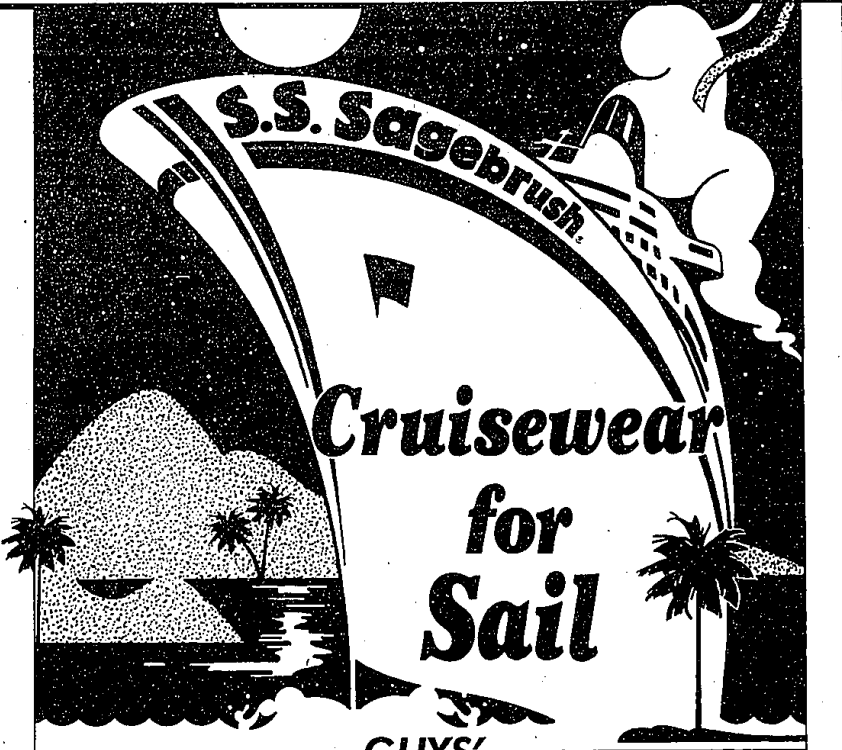
Seniors at least 60 years of age can obtain free assistance in filling out 1986 federal and state income tax forms.
