Council uphoids denial of spa license

In a repeat performance Monday,
Farmington Hills City Council upheld city clerk Joan Roynolds' Feb.
4 denial of Shinn's 1987 license re-

quest.
The council's 6-1 vote Mooday mirrored an earlier vote in November – the first test of the city's massage ordinance – when the spa operator's 1988 licenso request was dended. As in the learlier vote, councilwoman Joan Dudley opposed license denial. Showenher, Shine Blot sult in U.S. District Court in Detroit, claim-

ing the city's ordinance is unconsti-tutional. The suit was filed against the seven-member city council, Rey-nolds and Police Chief William Dwy-

er.
Shinn's attorney, Milton Spokojny, refused comment after Monday's special hearing, City attorneys Paul Bibeau and Derk Beckerteg said the constitutional said is continuing and that more than likely, Spokojny will amend the complaint to include the latest license denial.

THE SPECIAL hearing Monday was scheduled on U.S. District Judge Barbarn Hackett's order Jan. 28. She ordered the city to consider Shilm's request for a 1987 license. Hackett three times has denied Shilm's request for a temporary restraining order allowing her to reopen her business.

"Factually, not a great deal has changed," said Beckerleg, at the hearing's start. The only change is the December police raid on Shina's Southfield business, Shogun Oriental Health Spa, 23100 Telegraph, he said. Two female employees have since pleaded not guilty to accessing and soliciting charges.

"That goes to somewhat corre-borate the council's last decision (to deny Shinn a license)," Beckerleg said, referring to the Southfield raid, But from the start, Spokojny charged that a fair hearing before the Farmington Hills City Council would be impossible.

would be impossible.

"In my own heart, I don't think I can get a fair hearing before this body," he said.

Spokoloy told council members that none of the responses in Reynolds two-page denial letter showed Shina violates provisions of the city's massage regulation ordinance. Reasons for the denial "have no validity, no basis in fact," he added.


IEVNOLDS' LETTER details the city's reasons for denying Shinn's li-crose request. The letter addresses the conviction of three of Shinn's To-kyo spa employers on prostitution-related charges and refers to the contribited spa raid. Also listed as a decial reason is the former prostitution-related charges brough against Shinn when she operated a bealth spa in Waterford. Shinn was never convicted on the charges.

"The character, reputation and moral integrity of Ms. Un Cha Shinn as the operator of the Tokyo Health Spa in the past and as proposed is iminical to the public health, safety, morals and general welfare..." acrolling to the letter.

Other reasons given for denial include Shins' deliberate falsifications' of her first license application and that the Southfield spa is operating without a license.

Spokojny questioned each of the city's reasons for denial and challenged the council to find "a good reason" to deny the license.

CLAIMS THAT Shinn falsified her 1986 application are irrelevant, Spokolny said, because the request before the council is for a 1987 appli-cation. deliberately falsified and an amend-de application was made though the council chose not to consider it at the November hearing. The federal judge told city officials their refusal to consider the amended application was improper, Spokoloy spiled. "There is no indication that any-thing in the present application is a falsification," Spkoloy said.

Questioning other city claims, Spokolopy reminded the council that Spokolopy reminded the council that Shilm has never been convicted of a crime and that her employees' con-victions are not grounds for depicted her a license. "How can you deep something that hasn't been issued?" Spokolopy asked. "There are no legal reasons in

Bibeau reminded the council to consider Shinn's "unusual altuation" in Farmington Hills. The health spa was operating prior to ordinance enactment. "We would be right back here on a revocation hearing," Bi-beau said.

THE MAESAGE ordinance, Bi-beau said, covers license denials. To grant Shinn a license, "just wouldn't be appropriate under the circum-stances."

"She (Judge Hackett) indicated more or less to us the city had acted properly," Beckerleg said, referring to the council's earlier license deni-

"Consider what the city clerk put in the letter and consider the history of Mrs. Shinn," Beckerleg said, re-ferring to the Southfield spa.

While the majority of the council remained convinced that Shinn should not receive a license, Councilwoman Joan Dudley was uncertain.


