A Farmington Hills company will be one of 30 Michigan mannifications whose representatives accompany state Commerce director Dong Ross and state officials to a Fude mission in Los Angeles March 23, 100 Michigan Land Commerce of the Commer

ing programs, photography and art work.

Organized by the Commerce Department's Office of Federal Procurement Assistance, the trade
mission is designed to help Michigan companies here more defense
work from the United States government — the world's largest purchaser of manufactured goods.

"Doing business with the federal
government is big business," Ross
said. "The state's foderal procurement program has helped spproximately 2,500 companies last year
successfully complete for contracts.

"By serving as a matchmaker
for area businesses, over \$450 million in government contracts were

awarded to Michigan firms during the past fiscal year through the statewide program. Those con-tracts had an impact on more than 3,000 jobs."

THE TRADE missions allow state government to link small companies capable of providing the required goods and services, with federal government prime contractors who are looking to buy specific smalles.

tors who are looking to buy specific supplies.

The Los Angeles trip will provide participants with exposure to parts buyers of military and aerospace systems for the federal government — contacts they would be difficult for these business representatives to make on their own.
