John Jacob Astor's mammoth American Fur Co. when, after her husband's death, she took over the family's fur trading business. Madelon Stockwell Turner was the first woman to enter University of Michigan, and so qualified that she entered as a sophomore.

Viola Corrigan is Anderson's grandmother, who raised 13 children in Newaygo.

ANDERSON HAS, since 1984, criss-crossed the state innumerable

times staging her show for universities, high schools, folk festivals, music societies and historical societies. She has played before 7,000 persons, she estimates, from the Indiana line to Manning Bay. Her appearance here will be the first in this area.

The singer-songwriter has received a sesquicentennial grant from Michigan Commerce Department that will allow her program to be put into radio form. It is to be aired on National Public Radio stations throughout the year.

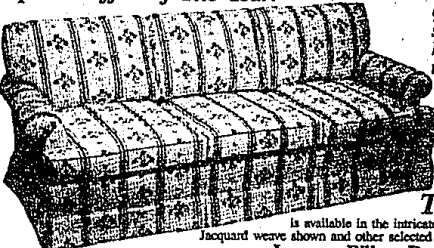
