Job goes beyond editing shows

Since that time, his creativity and skills, perseverance and dry sense of humor has brought him jobs and projects in our television center. Todd primarily works as part-time cable coordinator for Novi. He is an independent producer, dearly loving the excitement of the auto races.

He not only produces in video, but is a journalist and photographer. National auto magazines publish his works. In his spare time, Todd helps out wherever he is needed by his friends and peers and recently has taken on additional work as cable-caster for MetroVision.

Todd reflects on his very hectic schedule and thoughtfully offers some suggestions to our family of community television. He encourages me to remind all how we need to remember to completely finish our new program.

Everyone is so excited to finish editing their shows, they give little thought to possibly the most important of all steps — preparation for cablecasting by labeling and timing your show. Surprised? The cablecaster inserts your program into the on-line playback deck.

What our cablecaster looks for is:

- To verify correct tape — label of Title and Timing to be in three locations, on front of cassette box, on its end and on the videotape itself.

- Count down and color bars — MetroVision has a master tape for your convenience with a stack count down, color bars and black.

These four elements will determine how smooth the transitions are in our Channel 12 from one show to another. Mary Coway, Doug Wood

The board of directors of the Catholic Social Services of Wayne County has elected attorney Fred Harris to serve a one-year term as chairman of the board.

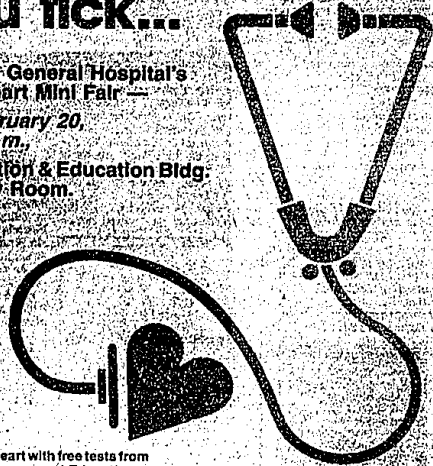
The Farmington Hills resident is a past president of CSS and has been a member of the board since 1967.
