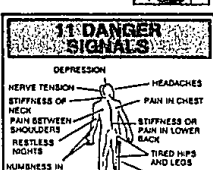

Proposals are to be contained in an opaque sealed envelope, which shall be identified as "CONSTRUCTION BID" along with the Work Category Number and Description in the LOWER LEFT HAND CORNER.

Each proposal must be accompanied by a proposal guarantee in the amount of five percent (5%) of the base proposal. Guarantee shall be in the form of a bid bond executed by an approved Surety Company, or a certified check for the same amount made payable to the ROCHESTER COMMUNITY SCHOOLS. The proposal guarantee shall remain valid for a period of sixty (60) days from date of bid opening. Failure to enter into a Contract shall provide cause for forfeiture of said bid security.
