Educational series offered on drug, alcohol dependency

Alcohol, and drug use and misuse is the theme of an educational series that will span five consecutive Mondays.

Sessions will begin at 7:30 p.m. March 9, 16, 23 and 30, and April 6 at North Farmington High School, 32900 13 Mile, Farmington Hills. Co-sponsors are Farmington Families in Action and Farmington Public Schools. Several other community organizations are sponsors.

The series is presented by Henry Ford Hospital's Chemical Dependency Treatment Programs, serving adults and teens.

The series is provided as a community service. Speakers donate their time while sponsoring organizations provide informational materials.

Diabetes is a major contributor to heart disease, kidney disease and blindness. So when you support the American Diabetes Association, you fight some of the worst diseases of our time.

The fee covers printing and mailing. Per-person fees are \$6 for the series or \$2 per session. Senior citizens and students will be admitted free. You may register at the door. Scheduled sessions are:

March 30 — "Intervention" (a way to enable the chemically dependent person to accept help), Renee Genger, Henry Ford Hospital/Maple Grove community education coordinator. Movie: "The Intervention."

April 6 — "The Community's Response," Judy Ernst, Birmingham/Bloomfield Families in Action parent peer group coordinator. Movie: "Sons and Daughters, Drugs and Booz."
