Five part series set on the use, abuse of alcohol, drugs

An educational series for the community on alcohol and drug use and misuse will begin at 7:30 p.m. Monday, March 9, in North Farmington High School, 32900 13 Mile Road. The five-part series is a Henry Ford Hospital Chemical Dependency Treatment program and will continue on Mondays through April 6.

The series is given as a community service. Speakers are donating their time and the sponsoring organizations are providing informational materials for the participants.

A fee of \$5 is asked for the entire series for a family. Fee per session is \$2. Senior adults and students are admitted free. Registration is made by sending a check, made payable to Farmington Families in Action, to Farmington Families in Action, P.O. Box 2232, Farmington 48018-0232. Registration also can be made at the door at the first session.

The event is sponsored by Families in Action and Farmington Public Schools in cooperation with the two cities' councils, chamber of commerce and police departments; Farmington Ministerial Council; Farmington Area Advisory Council; and Farmington PTA Council.

Other cooperating sponsors are high school boosters clubs, Lions, Rotary, Optimists, Our Lady of Sorrows Parish Council and St. Fabian Elementary School.

THE SERIES begins with "Alcohol-Chemical Dependency," by Judy Wenger, community, education coordinator for Henry Ford Hospital-Ma-

plegrove, will tell about the disease's early indicators, progression and physical complications. Her talk will be followed by a movie, "It's Quit Tomorrow."

The session for March 16 is called "Alcohol, Drugs and Teens." Fred Schade, an evaluation therapist for Maplecroft Youth Treatment Center, will tell about the impact on the adolescent, indicators and progression. His talk is followed by the movie, "Recovering Young People."

The session for March 23 is "Impact on the Family." The speaker is William Harshman, therapist at Maplegrove. Movie for the evening is "The Family Trap."

The session for March 30 is "Intervention." Renee Geer's talk is followed by the movie, "The Intervention: A Recovering Family."

The series concludes April 6 with "The Community's Response." Judy Ernst, parent peer group coordinator for Birmingham-Bloomfield Families in Action, will tell what parents can do. The movies, "Sons and Daughters, Drugs and Booze," will tell what the community can do about the problem.

Henry Ford Hospital's chemical dependency treatment program serves metro-area adults through residential or intensive outpatient services at four locations and services at Maplegrove. Its outreach educates the community about chemical dependency is a joint project with Junior Leagues of Birmingham and Detroit.
