Listed are some of the Farmington-area police and fire calls reported during the past week:

● EXTORTION ALLEGED

A 26-year-old man charged with extortion and assault in Farmington Hills has waived extradition from Orange County, Calif.

Arraigned March 8 before Magistrate Dennis Pheny of 47th District Court, Kenneth James Trembath stood mute to single counts of extortion, assault with intent to do great bodily harm less than murder, assault with intent to commit a felony, and possession of a firearm in the commission of a felony.

An innocent plea was entered in his behalf. Bond was set at \$100,000 pending a preliminary examination in 47th District Court.

The charges stem from an argument that broke out at Independence Green Apartments at 2:30 a.m. Feb. 20, said detective Sgt. Dennis Rochford of the Farmington Hills Police Department.

The victim, a 29-year-old Detroit man, was treated at Botsford General Hospital, Farmington Hills. Trembath was arrested on a traffic charge Feb. 26 in Anaheim, Calif., Rochford said.

If convicted of extortion, Trembath faces up to 20 years in prison. He faces a mandatory two-year prison term if convicted of felony firearm possession.

● CHARGES FILED

Two men face felony charges following their arrest outside the Holiday Inn of Farmington Hills, 38123 10 Mile, March 7.

Both men stood mute at their arraignment March 7 before Magistrate Dennis Pheny of 47th District Court. Innocent pleas were entered in their behalf.

One man, an 18-year-old Novi man, was charged with carrying a pistol in a vehicle, punishable upon conviction by up to five years in prison and a \$2,500 fine. His bond was set at \$5,000, pending a preliminary examination in 47th District Court.

The other, a 19-year-old New York

man, was charged with possession of a controlled substance (cocaine) less than 50 grams, punishable upon conviction by up to four years in prison and a \$2,000 fine. His bond was set at \$10,000.

Special Patrol Operational Team officers arrested the men, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

● SUSPECTS NABBED

A 17-year-old Taylor youth is charged with unlawfully driving away an automobile in Farmington Hills.

Arraigned March 8 before Magistrate Dennis Pheny of 47th District Court, the youth pleaded not guilty.

Bond was set at \$1,000 pending a preliminary examination in 47th District Court. Conviction could bring a penalty of up to five years in prison.

Special Patrol Operational Team officers arrested the youth in connection with the reported theft of a 1984 Pontiac Fiero from Fairmont Park Apartments March 7-8, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

● HOUSE FIRE

Property damage from a house fire on Farmington Road, north of 12 Mile, March 7, was estimated at \$30,000. The fire started on the south side of the house when a child playing with matches ignited leaves. It spread to the house's overhang, then to the attic, according to a Farmington Hills Fire Department report.

● SUSPICIOUS FIRE

The Fire Department is investigating a suspicious incident in which a car reported stolen from Farmington was found torched in Detroit.

According to a Farmington Department of Public Safety report, the 1974 Mercedes Benz was stolen from a driveway on Brookdale between 1 and 11:30 a.m. March 8. The Detroit Fire Department found it at 9 a.m. March 9. The car was valued at \$8,000.
