



Youth Symphony giving concert

Metropolitan Youth Symphony will perform at historic Orchestra Hall at 5 p.m. on Sunday. The concert celebrates the Youth Symphony's fifth anniversary and its fourth appearance at Orchestra Hall.

Recognition will be given to the invited music educators in attendance for their role in encouraging the 240 young musicians of the Metro Youth Symphony.

Gary Tolh of Troy, president of

the Metro Youth Symphony, credits the many school music teachers and private music instructors with the important role they have played in helping students develop a love of music and the ability to perform.

The program will feature Edward Grieg's Holberg Suite, Jean Sibelius' Finlandia and Gustav Mahler's Symphony No. 1 in D Major.

Metropolitan Youth Symphony is comprised of three orchestras of

three levels of musical proficiency.

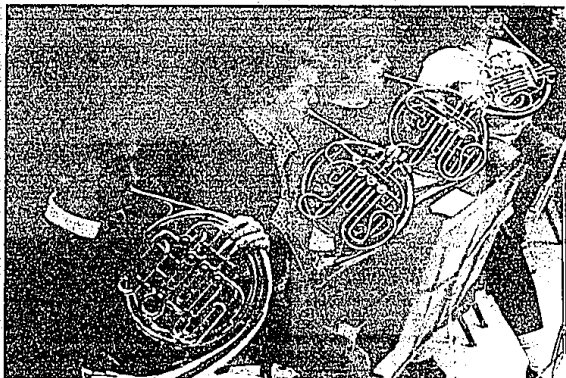
The Symphony Orchestra will be led by Alan MacNair, concertmaster of the Rochester Symphony and director of the Troy High School Orchestra.

The Concert Orchestra will be conducted by Douglas Bianchi, director of instrumental music at L'Anse Creuse High School - North and the String Orchestra will be headed by Judith Culler, string teacher in the Troy school system.

This anniversary concert, the major fundraiser of the year, is partially funded by a \$500 grant from the Southfield Arts Council. Orchestra members from 35 Metro area communities rehearse Saturday mornings at Southfield-Lathrup High School.

Basso John Paul White will perform in concert at 3 p.m. Sunday at Oakland University.

The assistant professor of music in the department of music, theater and dance will present works by Handel, Haydn, Wolf, Mahler, Tchaikovsky, Mussorgsky and Weill. He will be accompanied by Stanley Hollingsworth, composer in residence at the university.

White has performed extensively throughout the United States, West Germany and Switzerland.

He has been a soloist with major American opera companies and symphony orchestras.

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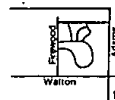
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
