Theological Education Week observed by Greeks

The Greek Orthodox Church of the Holy Cross in Farmington Hills will celebrate Theological Education Week on March 22-28.

The Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of North and South America has designated the week to draw attention to the importance of practicing faith in daily lives, to encourage theological education on the parish level and to draw attention to the effort of Hellenic College and Holy Cross Greek Orthodox School of Theology in Brookline, Mass.

The focus of this year's observance is on the celebration of the 50th Anniversary of the establishment of Holy Cross. As part of this celebration, the school is sponsoring a number of special lectures, symposia and theological conferences throughout the academic year.

Holy Cross Greek Orthodox School of Theology offers graduate education. Founded as Holy Cross Theological Seminary in 1937, in Pomfret, Conn., the school serves as the only seminary of the Greek Orthodox Church in the Americas. In 1947 the institution moved to Brookline and in 1968 it was expanded to include a four-year liberal arts under-
