Neurologist looks at music making

Dr. Frank Wilson, neurologist and author of the book, "Tone Deaf and All Thumbs? An Invitation to Music-Making for Late Bloomers and Non-Prodigies," will give a lecture at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday at Smith Theatre, Orchard Ridge Campus, Oakland Community College. Tickets are \$2.50. All proceeds will be donated to the Music Study Club of Metropolitan Detroit, a non-profit organization that supports young, talented musicians. Wilson, an amateur pianist, be-

lieves that systematic and consistent musical instruction can help refine and develop a person's brain and neuro-muscular system, and that "Evidence seems quite compelling that everyone has what it takes to be at least some kind of musician." Wilson will be co-director of the "1987 Etiology of Music Making Conference" in Denver this summer. He will be at Hammill Music in Livonia to talk to people and autograph his book 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. Tuesday.
