

New look in works for established center

Renovation of Hunters Square/Tally Hall, which began in January, is nearing completion. Schothak Brothers & Co., Inc., managing agents for the 7-year-old shopping center, are overseeing a revitalization that includes physical improvements, an updated decor, and an improved tenant mix and merchandise focus.

"We are very pleased with the progress of both the physical renovation and the new tenants our leasing department are bringing to the center," said Robert Schothak, vice president.

Phase I, the physical renovation of

Tally Hall, is on schedule. At the main front entrance, neon graphics, mirrors and a new color scheme have been completely "revoluted" and "Broadway" lights will follow.

Inside, neon graphics, a new color scheme, checkerboard graphics and new tables have been installed. New chairs, color-coordinated banners, hanging store signs and plants are planned for this month. Architectural renderings of the new Tally Hall are on display near the front entrance.

SEVERAL NEW tenants have been announced for both Hunters

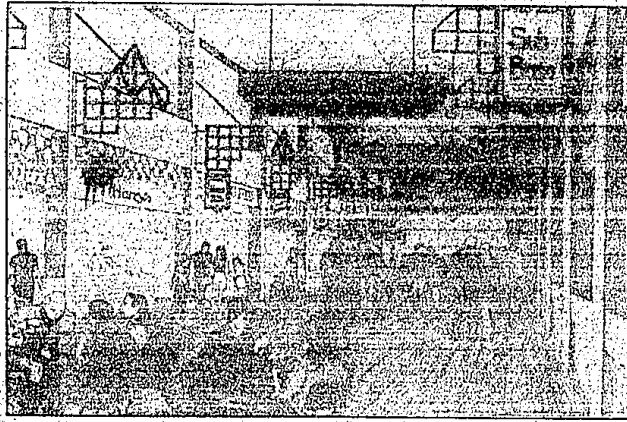
Square and Tally Hall.

Re-leasing with an improved tenant mix is a major element of the center's overall renovation, said James Bohannon, vice president of shopping center leasing for Schothak Brothers.

Seven stores — now, remodeled or enlarged — are to be opened by September. Several more leases are under negotiation.

March openings are expected for CaddyShack, a pro-golf equipment, accessory and apparel store; and an expanded Sherri's, specializing in ladies day and evening wear.

The Fudgery, a fudge shop featuring entertaining presentations by the staff, is scheduled to open in Tally Hall in June. Continental Meats, a tenant in Tally Hall, will re-open a remodeled store by April. Baby and Me, a children's apparel and maternity store, is slated for a May or June opening. Both Winkelman's and Rave, a junior sportswear store, project September openings.
