Some say it's the ideal setting for a vacation, nestled in the hills of northern Michigan along the Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore. The backdrop of Leelanau County is the artist's paradise, with lakes, rivers, old barns, scenic villages and rolling orchards for inspiration, Artists can choose from courses in watercolor, weaving, mixed

media, sculpture, papermaking and acrylics. Writers also find the serenity and tranquility of Leelanau to be just the place for the Michigan Northwoods Writers Conference held in July, Writing for television has been added to the schedule with one of the busiest screenwriters in Los Angeles instruction.

The Enrichment Programs also offer opportunities for personal development. "Adventures in Attitudes" discusses the effect of attitudes on our personal and professional lives and shows how to improve these attitudes resulting in a greater sense of self-worth, an ability to cope and improved motivation and productivity. The second annual Women's Conference takes a sharp look at the problems that many woemen are dealing with today. A variety of topics will be explored such as finances, fitness, fashion and consumer savvy in addition to the deeper concerns of balancing a career and family; bringing your world and your husband's together; finding fulfillment in your life; and surviving dramatic changes in lifestyle.

Up-to-date information on world issues as seen from the perspective of experts in the fields of journalism, the military, the humanities, government and education, is provided during the 35th World Affairs Symposium. The theme for 1987 is: "2020 Vision."

Leelanau hasn't left the active seniors out of its programming either. When Elderhostel Inc. was founded to provide elder citizens with an intellectual and physical adventure, Leelanau became a host institution of the program and now offers more summer Elderhostel courses that any other institution in the Midwest.

The Leclanau Enrichment Programs are part of the Leclanau Center for Education,

a nonprofit corporation with a history dating back to 1929. Participants may stay on Leclanau's 83/acre campus in elther rustic cabins or school dormitories, both just a short walk away from the sandy shoreline of Lake Michigan. The Crystal River, a beautiful trout stream, runs through the campus, providing a convenient outlet for canoelsts. Participants may also utilize the four tennis courts maintained on campus.
