Local museums and historic sites provide residents and tourists alike with an op-portunity to discover the area's historical past; what it was then that has helped to make the present what it is now. ligan heritage.

During this year of Michigan's 150th birthday, the following list will get you started on your way to becoming more historically knowledgeable about where you live and visit.

Grand Traverse County City Opera House

Said to be one of the finest examples of Victorian opera houses in the midwest, the Opera House is currently undergoing Opera House is currently undergoing phase II of its extensive restoration. Built in 1891 by three local businessmen, its heyday years were from 1892-1897 when numerous operettas, plays, grand balls, concerts, lectures, and graduation exceptions to hance there. concerts, lectures, and ercises took place there.

It is currently being enjoyed by com-munity organizations for concerts, dances, wedding receptions, and other public and private meetings and gatherings. Wednesdays through Saturdays from "June 17 through Labor Day Tempest Pro-

ductions of Traverse City has scheduled shows with 8 p.m. curtain times.


