

Franklin Learns Value Of PAT

What started as a rough season for Livonia Franklin High's football team has developed into a happy one.

Meantime, for Birmingham Groves, the 1970 season will be remembered as the one when a single point...

Franklin kept alive its hopes for at least a share of the Northwest Suburban League title by downing Groves, 13-12, in overtime.

Franklin is 3-1 in the league and 4-2 overall, with Thurston only left on its league slate Saturday afternoon. A Franklin win and a North Farmington loss would result

in the two teams sharing the pennant.

As for Groves, there'll be no crown flying around 13 Mile Road...and all because of those one-point losses.

Franklin's John Groves had lost when an attempt to go for a two-point conversion, which would have won the game instead of trying for one point and a tie, failed.

This time, Groves went ahead early, but lost again in the end, and it was a Franklin conversion which decided the game.

GROVES STRUCK for a 12-0 lead when the Birmingham

team marched 59 yards in the first period with passes from Tom Rex to Drew Jackman chewing up a great deal of yardage before Rex passed the final four yards to Scott Chester for a 12-0 lead.

Then in the second period, Groves marched 45 yards in five plays with a Rex to Chester pass the big gainer to the five from where John Lamb dove in for the touchdown.

Franklin's John Pipo was experiencing funnies troubles.

Once the Livonians gave the ball away on the Groves 11.

Then John Casey exploded

for a 49-yard scoring run and Dave Morrison booted what proved the game's deciding point to secure a win with a 13-12 final at the half.

The game sawed for a good share of the third period before Mark Lehto of Franklin grabbed a punt on his own 40 and was off to the races. He dashed 60 yards to score and that was that.

FRANKLIN EARLIER had lost a touchdown after a sparkling 60-yard punt return by Don Opland, a 15-yard clipping penalty being detected.

When the game ended Franklin was the move again on the Groves 3.

John Pipo again was the workhorse of the Franklin attack. For the third game this season it gained over 100 yards, rolling up 123.

The front four of the Franklin defensive line were solid and compact. Jim Craig, Scott Louis, Jim Griffin and Mike Lynch all combined to keep Groves well in check after the first half.

Franklin totaled 214 yards rushing and added seven yards by making two out of eight.

Groves did most of its damage via the aerial route, clicking on 12 out of 27 for 112 yards. On the ground, Groves was held to 19 yards.

Franklin made six first downs, Groves seven.

Groves has one league game left...against John Glenn Friday night.
