While there are quite a few estab-lished chamber music series with a good track record, there is always room for more. The latest on the scene is "Chamber Music, Unlimit-ed," taking place at the McAuley Au-ditorium, in Mercy College of De-troit.

The first featured pianist Jaqueline Schmitt, a frequent chamber performer. Her efforts in behalf of quality music are unrelenting and uncompromising. On this program, she was joined by Detroit Symptony Orchestra violist Vincent Lionti. Most of the program was works for piano and viola.

The repertoire for this combina-tion is limited. It is a real challenge to come up with a program for these instruments which is sufficiently rewarding and eventful.
