OU swim coach quits

Mary Ellen Wydan submitted her resignation last week as Oakland University's women's awim coach. Trace Huth, former All-American swim star for OU's men's team, was immediately announced as Wydan's replacement.

"When I decided to spend my life coaching swimming, the collegiate level is where I wanted to be," said Huth, who has coached the Oakland Live Yers age group swim program the past two years. "Under the been in this area long enough to see the kind of talent that's here, and there's enough to build a national championship contender."

That was something Wydan.

That was something Wydan failed to do in her four years at OU.

Under the Delaware graduate's guldance, the Lady Pioneer program slipped from fourth in the NCAA Division II meet to 11th this season. They were 3-11 in dual meets this year and 19-25 in her four years at the helm.

WITH ONLY 11 swimmers and four divers on the team to begin the 1986-87 season, it was apparent the program was stagnating. OU scored 70 points at this year's NCAA II meet; 69 of those were by swimmer. Nancy Schermer and diver Lee Am O'Nell.

Considering the success posted by OU's men's team under Pete Hovland – the Pioneers have finished among the top three in the NCAA II meet in five of his six seasons — it was hoped the women's program would follow suit.

The two seasons prior to Wy-

dan's arrival, OU placed third and fifth in the NCAA II meet. After a fourth in her initial season, however, the Lady Ploneers dropped to 12th, eighth and, this year, 11th.

"ONE OF THE main things the program needs is numbers," said Huth. "What we need is a few good swimmers with some versatility, then we need to try and increase our numbers." sago, this program task a few if the control of the contro
