

## police/fire calls

### MOTORIST ROBBED

A 28-year-old Detroit man was robbed of \$50 by another man whose car struck him from behind at 6:45 p.m. April 4 on westbound I-696 near Orchard Lake Road in Farmington Hills. The robbery occurred after the


