NATURE STUDY TOUR — Farmington-area families may explore the 212-acre park for the signs of spring and wild flowers that inhabit Heritage Park. Tina Nowicki will begin the nature interpretive program with describing the flowers, their growth season, soil and weather conditions required for their existence. The program will be held from 10 a.m. to noon Saturday, April 18. Fee is \$3 per person or \$7 per family.

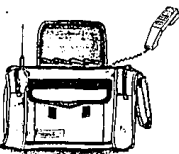
Sellinsky ALSO was elected to Albion's College's Student Senate. It is the governing body over campus organizations and activities.

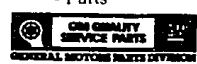
