

Capital plan OK'd

The city's most important capital projects are highlighted in Farmington's Six Year Capital Improvement Program, approved by planning commissioners April 13.

The \$11.6 million program looks from 1987 through 1992 and was reviewed and discussed by city council members Monday. Proposed projects would be paid for by a variety of bonding proposals and local, state and federal money.

Remaining at the top of the list is the widening of Orchard Lake Road, followed by local street improvements, including those in the Chatham Hills subdivision.

The city's Downtown Development Authority project in the central business district was next in

line, followed by a new storm drain installation on Orchard Lake Road, a 1988 residential sidewalk program on the north side of Grand River and some changes in city buildings.

Also on the program is the purchase of capital equipment, the building of an outside storage facility for the public services department, building a new recreation facility if it becomes necessary and the building of bike paths — something that has been on the list for the past 15 years.

Mayor William Hartsock said the program brought "no surprises" to the council.

"We've certainly talked about the major improvements for some time now," he said.

Travel exec studies up

Angel Bakos, consultant of Botsford Inn in Farmington Hills, attended the National Tour Association's fourth annual spring tour and travel exchange in Lexington, Ky.

The spring exchange, held at the Lexington Civic Center in early April, was attended by 1,200 delegates from the United States and Canada.

The Lexington exchange also offered delegates the chance to participate in one of four tours of Kentucky.

The National Tour Association is a travel industry organization in North America, representing 500 tour companies that package and sell group vacations, and 2,500 supplier members, such as hotels, attractions, restaurants, sightseeing companies and public sector tourism agencies such as state, local and regional travel organizations.
