Concern voiced about espionage

AP — U.S. Rep. William Broomfield, R-Birmingham, has proposed that the United States and the Soviet Union abandon the new embassies that each is building in the other's country because of concerns about Soviet espionage.

Broomfield said the embassies shouldn't be occupied because the new U.S. embassy in Moscow reportedly is filled with Soviet eavesdropping devices and the new Soviet embassy in Washington is being built on a hill where the Soviets may be able to intercept U.S. communications.

"I think we should stop work on both sites, and we'll take over the one here in Washington and they'll take over the one in Moscow," said Broomfield, whose district includes the Farmington area. "I know it's drastic, but I think our whole worldwide intelligence system has been compromised."

Under legislation Broomfield introduced April 6, the United States would withdraw from portions of a

1969 treaty with the Soviet Union under which the two nations agreed to swap sites for new embassies.

Broomfield said each country would pay the other for the money it had invested in its new embassy, and then the two nations could start over and make sure any new agreement was based "on a fair sense of reciprocity."

"It is clear from the review of problems already identified at the U.S. Embassy in Moscow and other embassy facilities elsewhere, that we are facing a security, diplomatic and intelligence disaster that is unparalleled in recent history," Broomfield said.

Broomfield also said new charges that two Marines allowed Russian agents to roam the existing U.S. embassy in Moscow should prompt Secretary of State George Shultz to rethink his trip to the Soviet Union and to consider meeting Soviet Foreign Minister Eduard Shevardnadze in some other country.

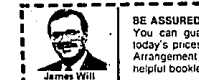
