"Creation of a department would demonstrate that issues affecting children and families are a priority

to addressing these concerns," the panel said.

The Task Force recommends that county or regional departments be set up to provide a minimum level of services to all children, regardless of where they live.

The report contains a "blueprint" for local and state service delivery, including a financing proposal aimed at encouraging local governments to provide more than minimum services. There also are suggestions for

helping counties during money short-ages.
