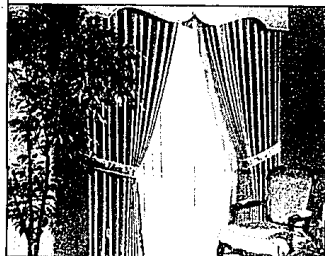
"That was a wonderful idea that I got from some members of Grace Memorial Chapel when they gave gift certificates instead of food," Crampton said. "So many of our sen-
