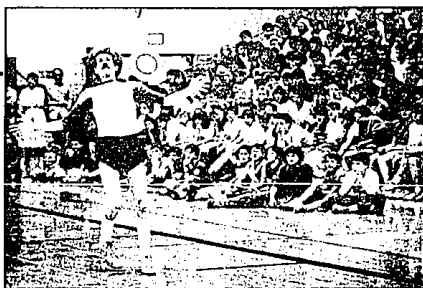

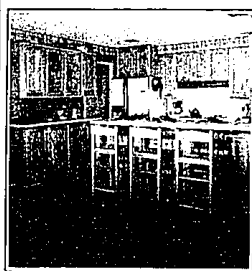

CITY OF FARMINGTON COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS (Summary)

A regular meeting of the Farmington City Council was called to order by Mayor Hartsock at 8:07 p.m. on May 4, 1987, in Council Chambers, 23600 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan.

PRESENT: Campbell, Hartsock, Richardson, Tupper.
ABSENT: Yoder.
OTHERS PRESENT: City Manager Deadman, Director Billing, Director Lauboff, City Clerk Dabney.
Minutes of the previous meetings were approved as written.

The Mayor presented a State Proclamation, a City Proclamation and a plaque to Mrs. Abid on behalf of her husband, Nicholas, in recognition of his achievements as an educator.

Minutes of other boards were received and/or filed.
Council granted a sign variance to Ruben's Reuben, 30746 Grand River, to install a backlighted awning.

Council granted three and denied two of the five requested sign variances for the Mobil Oil Station at 33330 Eight Mile Road.
Council received notice of the Michigan Municipal League's annual convention to be held in Detroit in September.

Council supported Senate Bill 67 and House Bill 4152, which would amend the present Workers Disability Compensation Act.
Council supported the City of Birmingham's resolution concerning cable television agreements.

The following proclamations were issued by Council:
NATIONAL MUSIC WEEK - May 3-10, 1987;
SMALL BUSINESS WEEK - May 10-16, 1987
Council authorized the purchase of road salt for the 1987-88 winter season through the State of Michigan Extended Purchasing Program.
Council authorized an expenditure of \$13,000 for the City's participation in the 1987 Oakland County Tri-Party Agreement.

Council rejected the bids received on April 14, 1987, for the 1987 Major Road Program, and authorized the project to be rebid as three separate contracts.
Council waived the bid process and awarded the concrete street replacement contract to Italia Construction in the amount of \$22,855.50.

Council established a Public Hearing at 7:30 p.m. on May 18, 1987, to amend the Economic Development Corporation project plan for the Farmington/9 Mile Associates.

Council adopted a resolution adjusting the General Fund, the Water and Sewer Fund and the Highway Fund and expenditures of the 1986-87 budget.
Council established a Public Hearing to review the 1987-88 Budget, at 8:00 p.m. on May 18, 1987, and authorized the City Clerk to publish Notice of the Hearing.
Councilwoman Richardson commended the Farmington Senior High School students who were present and preparing for Student Government Day.
Council confirmed the Mayor's appointment of John Donohue to fill the unexpired term of Richard Donner, who recently resigned from the DDA Board of Directors.

Council received the General Fund and 47th District Court financial reports for nine months ended March 31, 1987, and the Water & Sewer Fund for the quarter ended March 31, 1987.
Monthly bills were approved for payment.
Meeting adjourned at 9:42 p.m.
