

Students have chance to display creativity

AN EXCELLENT exhibition hall, "exquisite" pottery and other creative works were all part of the Creativity Springs Alive day Saturday at North Farmington High School.

But Saturday's sunny weather was more of a detriment to the attendance than was expected.

"We had a steady crowd, but not what we would have liked," said Paul Barber, the Farmington district's music coordinator, who chaired the Creativity committee.

There was a significant difference in attendance from the previous year, he said.

Barber said the start of the school year, Mother's Day and the warm weather all contributed to the decline in attendance this year.

The Creativity Committee will meet May 21 to review the 1987 event and make plans for the 1988 event, sponsored by the school district. The committee will discuss possibly returning the event to an earlier date to tie into the local OM Competition — which was held earlier this year.

Twenty Farmington schools showed a variety of works throughout North Farmington High. There were works from elementary, middle schools, high schools and from Cloverdale and Farmington Training Center, Barber said.

Fine art, industrial art and marketing displays were combined with music, drama and forensics perfor-

mances and many other activities that filled the school with student creations.

"The caliber of work is tremendous," Barber added.

Informational videotapes of the event were taken. They will be presented to faculty members this fall.
