Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police and fire calls received during the past week.

MAN SENTENCED

An illegal alien from Yugoslavia was sentenced to 18 years in prison after pleading guilty to conducting a continuing criminal enterprise, a cocaine smuggling ring.

Bella Djokovic was sentenced May 14 by U.S. District Judge Averil Cohn of Detroit. He was unemployed and living with his brother in Farmington Hills at the time of his arrest Dec. 15 in Detroit.

He will be deported upon release from prison, according to Cohn's ruling.

SENTENCING DELAYED

Sentencing for Paul Dober, 18, of Livonia was postponed for the fourth time last week, according to Oakland County Circuit Court. Sentencing is now scheduled for Thursday, June 4.

Dober was convicted of assault with intent to murder in the rifle shooting of a guard at Putt 'N' Games on Grand River in Farmington Hills in the fall of 1985.

Circuit Judge James Thorburn handed down a guilty verdict March 3 following a bench trial. Dober remains lodged in the Oakland County Jail.

WORKER STRUCK

A maintenance worker was struck by a ball bearing while edging the lawn at the Farmington Community Library, 32737 12 Mile, at 11:30 a.m. May 14.

Larry Maynor, 42, of Detroit was not seriously hurt.

Maynor felt something hit his left side, then saw a ball bearing, a half inch in diameter, fall to the ground. It possibly was fired from a passing van, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

LARCENY ALLEGED

Two Detroit men face larceny charges in connection with the reported theft of \$276 worth of shrubs from the Kmart Garden Shop, 30800 Orchard Lake, at 3:40 a.m. May 14.

Arraigned Thursday in 47th District Court, the two — one 36, the other 32 — stood mute to single counts of larceny over \$100. Innocent pleas were entered in their behalf. Bond was set at \$5,000 for each pending a preliminary exam in 47th District Court. The penalty upon conviction is five years in prison and a \$2,500 fine.

SUSPECTS NABBED

Three Farmington Hills teenagers face felony charges in connection with the reported burglary of a house in Colony Park subdivision April 23.

Arraigned May 14 before District Judge Margaret Schaeffer of Farmington, the three — one 18-year-old and two 17-year-olds — stood mute to single counts of breaking and entering of an occupied dwelling with intent to commit larceny and of unlawfully driving away an automobile.

Innocent pleas were entered in their behalf. Personal bond was set pending a preliminary exam in 47th District Court. Conviction of the two counts could bring a penalty of up to 15 years in prison.

The three were arrested April 24 in connection with the reported theft of a 1984 Ford Thunderbird, stereo equipment and jewelry from a house on Colony Park Drive the night before, said Sgt. Dennis Rochford of the Farmington Hills Police Department.

The car and most of the other property were recovered, Rochford said.

Warrants for the suspects' arrest were issued by Magistrate James Brady of 47th District Court April 29.

TICKETS ISSUED

A 20-year-old Farmington Hills man and an 18-year-old Farmington

man were ticketed for possessing open intoxicants after officers came upon their car at Independence Green Apartments May 14 and found open beer, according to a Farmington Hills police report.
