O MAN SENTENCED An illegal alien from Yugoslavia was sentenced to 18 years in prison after pleading guilty to conducting a continuing criminal enterprise, a co-

continuing criminal enterprise, a co-caine smuggling ring. Bella Djokovic was sentenced May 14 by U.S. District Juge Avern Cohn of Detroit. He was unemployed and living with his borther in Farming-tion Hills at the time of his arrest Dec. 15 in Detroit. He will be deported upon release from prison, according to Cohn's rul-ing.

O SENTENCING DELAYED Sentencing for Paul Dober, 18, of Livonia was postponed for the fourth time last week, according to Oak-land County Circuit Court, Sentenc-ing is now scheduled for Thursday, June 4.

Dober was convicted of assault Dober was convicted of assault with intent to murder in the rifle shooting of a guard at Putt 'N' Games on Grand River in Farming-ton Hills in the fail of 1985. Circuit Judge James Thorburn handed down a guilty verdict March J following a bench trial. Dober re-mains lodged in the Oakland County Jail.
