

# Raiders, Falcons split pair

Joe Sturtz' two-run homer was the game-winning hit in North Farmington's 6-2 baseball victory over Farmington Wednesday, but the Falcons came back to win the second half of the double-header 11-4.

The Raiders trailed 2-0 in the first game when Jerry Hakala singled home a run in the fourth inning, and Sturtz followed with his homer in the fifth after Mark Taylor had drawn a walk.

Taylor was two-for-three, scored twice and stole two bases, Trent Hiner had an RBI single and Gerry Haight's suicide bunt accounted for another North run.

Rick Karcher, 1-3, went the distance for the win. He allowed four hits, walked eight and struck out five.

Steve Howell scattered seven hits and was the loser for Farmington, despite striking out eight and walking four. Eric Green had an RBI single for the Falcons.
