**1987 PAVEMENT STRIPING PROGRAM**

**CITIES OF FARMINGTON HILLS AND FARMINGTON OAKLAND COUNTY, MICHIGAN**

Sealed bids will be received by the City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan at the City Clerk's Office at 31555 Eleven Mile Road, Farmington Hills, until 10:00 a.m., Eastern Standard Time, June 2, 1987, at which time all proposals will be publicly opened and read aloud to the City of Farmington Hills City Clerk's Office. Proposal forms are available at the City Clerk's Office. Proposals must be submitted on proposal forms furnished by the City. Each proposal shall be accompanied by a Certified Check or Bid Bond by a recognized surety company in the amount of \$1,000 (one thousand dollars), payable to the City of Farmington Hills and Farmington, as surety for acceptance of the contract. All proposals shall be submitted in sealed envelopes and clearly labeled "Proposal - Farmington Hills/Farmington Pavement Striping Program, 1987." The successful bidder shall furnish to the City a surety bond in an amount at least equal to 100% of the sum total of the itemized proposal (including items 1, 2 and 3), as surety for faithful performance of the contract.

The work consists of applying centerline and edge pavement striping for the streets listed on the attached pavement striping schedule, including all labor, materials and equipment necessary to complete the work in accordance with the specifications contained in the bid documents. The total estimated mileage of streets to be striped is 42.56 miles, of which approximately 40 miles are under the jurisdiction of Farmington Hills and 2.56 miles are under the City of Farmington's jurisdiction.

Each City reserves the right to waive any or all proposals, to waive information and to make the award that, in the opinion of the City Council, is in the best interest and to the advantage of the Cities of Farmington Hills and Farmington.

**SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS**

**REGULAR CITY COUNCIL PUBLIC HEARING**

**MAY 18, 1987**

Mayor Marks opened the regular public hearing of the Farmington Hills City Council on May 18, 1987 at 7:30 p.m. Members present: Alkaeteb, Dolan, Dudley, Marks, Sever, Soronen and Wolf. Others present: City Manager Costick, Assistant City Manager Call, Deputy City Clerk Frey, City Attorney Bibeau, and Planning Consultant Coates.

Council introduced the following:

Zoning Map Amendment, Zoning Request 3-2-87, in NW ¼ of Section 18, located on north side of Hills Tech Drive, east of Hagerty, to rezone from RA-1 to IHO.

Zoning Map Amendment, Zoning Request 4-2-87, in NW ¼ of Section 2, Lots 19 thru 25 of Farmington Heights Subdivision, to rezone from OS-1 to P-1.

Zoning Map Amendment, Zoning Request 6-2-87, in SE ¼ of Section 36, Lots 601 thru 606 of Grand River Crest No. 2, to rezone from RA-1 to RC-3.

Council denied Zoning Map Amendment, Zoning Request 5-2-87, in NE ¼ of Section 12, located at 30719 Valley Drive, to rezone from RA-1A to OS-1.

Council approved the following Site Plans:

Cluster Site Plan 59-2-87, in NE ¼ of Section 8, located on SW corner of Drake and Thirteen Mile.

Cluster Site Plan 60-2-87, in SE ¼ of Section 11, Lots 4-6 of Hillside Subdivision.

Revised Cluster Site Plan 57-2-87, in NE ¼ of Section 32 and NW ¼ of Section 33, located south of Nine Mile between Halsted and Gull.

Council introduced amendment to Ordinance C-16-87, relative to Family and Group Day Care, Section 60.404, removing requirement of 500 ft. between homes and adding provision that licensed premises shall be subject to Fire Department inspection and shall provide smoke detectors in all daytime sleeping areas.

Council introduced the following:

Ordinance to amend Section 41.030 of City Code, to provide Civil penalty for violation of subsection (9) littering and depositing public streets.

Ordinance to amend Section 60.131 of City Code, to provide Civil penalty for building and/or construction activity on Sundays and legal holidays.

Ordinance to amend Section 43.020 (3) of City Code to provide Civil penalty for open burning.

Council approved Agreements with Michigan Department of Transportation and Oakland County Road Commission relative to Pebble Creek Bridge reconstruction on Twelve Mile Road, City Share being \$65,300.

Contract for 1987 Joint Sealing Program was awarded to Michigan Joint Sealing, Inc., in amount of \$43,800.

Council determined to combine regular City Council meeting and Budget Public Hearing meeting on Wednesday, May 27, 1987.

Meeting adjourned at 11:55 p.m.
