Walled Lake Consolidated already is one of the area's largest school districts with 8,630 students from West Bloomfield, Orchard Lake, Farmington Hills, Walled Lake, Wix-om, White Lake Township, Com-merce and Novi.

In the second attempt in two years to accommodate expected increases in population, board members agreed to redistrict the Maple Elementary School attendance area. The school is located on Maple at Haggerty in West Bloomfield. Approximately 140 students living in Chateau Estates at 13 Mile and Rousseau in Novi will be transferred next year. Half will be bused to Decker, the other half to Walled Lake Elementary. The school serves kindergartners through sixth graders who live in West Bloomfield, Farmington Hills and Novi. It is a feeder school for Walled Lake Junior Tigh and Walled Lake Western High School.

"WE HAVE a serious space problem," Dr. Hugh Davies, director of

Davies said he told the board when

year that further transfers would not

The Vilican-Leman study shows a potential of 517 additional young-sters to the Maple school attendance area, most of them in the West Bloomfield portion between Haggerty and Halsted and 14 Mile to Maple. Farmington Hills construction south of 14 Mile is also contributing to the expected space crunch.






