Free my son, he tells Soviet Union



LADIMIR MAGARIK has traveled throughout the United States and Europe, speaking, participating in running marathons. bicycling through campuses, leading a bunger strong country of the strong through campuses, leading a bunger strong through campuses, leading a bunger strong through campuses and find them. Every action was part of his campaign of diplomatic pressure to bring world attention to the plight of his son in a Soviet prison.

"It's been worth it. It's been effective. His sentence has been reduced by half. They aren't beating him any more. The harassment has stopped, said Magarik Thursday in Farmington Hills.

"We have no way of knowing for sure, but we think the campaign has prevented new arrests for Jewish activities (in the USSR) — at least there hasn't been any new arrests since some of the pressure of the campaign has been felt. We suspect Soviet officials are coming around to believing that their policies of harassment are proving counterproductive."

From the Farmington Hills home of Leonid Makar-Limanov, Magarik talked about his son's arrest, conviction and sontenec to three years in a Soviet labor camp. His stop in Farmington Hills, midway into his third tour of the United States in his campaign, was to attend the Solidarity Freedom Concert in Adat Shalom Synagogue.

THE FUND-RAISER was sponsored by the Jowish Community Council Soviet Jewry Committee in honor of the refuseniks, the Soviet Jews who have been refused exit visas, and in support of Magarik's efforts.

"We suspect Soviet officials are coming around to believing that their policies of harassment (toward refusenika) is prov-ing counterproductive," says Vladimir Magarik, father of an Imprisoned refusenik. treatment. Some of the time he has spent in a punishment cell, designed to inflict torture through cold and Isolation. He has been denied both visits and mail from his wife, Na-talia, his father said.

"Most prisoners are invalids with-in a year or two, even the young ones, particularly in the labor camps," Magarik said.

VLADIMIR MAGARIK and his daughter, Chana, longtime re-fusenliks, were granted their exit visas six years ago. They now live in Jerusalem.

"Aleksel stayed behind because he wanted to marry, Now, we are three generations of refuseniks; me, Aleksel, and my grandson, Chaim," Magarik said of Aleksel and Natalia's 18-month-old child.

"This is the first tour I'vo been without my deughter," Magarik said.
"She's always with me, but had to stay home this month to take exams."

On Magarik's visit here, he re-newed an old friendship with Makar-Limanov. Both grew up in Moscow, both attended Moscow University, where they majored in matmatics, both were longtime refusentiks. Makar-Limanov is now a profes-sor of mathematics at Wayne State University. Magarik said he is a math consultant for a firm in Jeruselem "with a very patient and compassionate and understanding boss."

The 1,000 people who attended the concert at Adat Shalom were asked to send cables of support to the Magarik family. They also were asked to send postcards demanding Alexel Magarik's release to Yuri Dublini, the Soviet ambassador to the United States.
