Scleroderma has puzzled physicians for ages. In fact, there is no known cause or cure. It affects more than 300,000 persons in the United States alone. Scleroderma is five times more prevalent than Muscular Dystrophy. Scleroderma affects both sexes and people of all ages from infant to elderly.

While the word "scleroderma" means "hard skin," internal organs, such as the esophagus, heart, lungs

and kidneys may also be affected. It can attack subtly, with many and varied symptoms making diagnosis difficult. Patients have suffered for years without knowing the true nature of their illness.
