Tennis clinics open

The Summer Tennis Program, for students and adults, begins on June 22, at the Academy of the Sacred Heart, 1250 Kensington Road, Bloomfield Hills. Tennis clinics are available for beginners and advanced beginners play. A junior competitive clinic is also offered. There are four sessions in each clinic. Course fees are \$35 for each two week session.

Adoption option offered

Catholic Social Services of Oakland County is looking for families who can adopt school-aged children. "Adopting children from 6-17 years can bring enrichment and joy to childless families as well as families whose children are grown," said Mary McGinnis of Catholic Social Services. "Often these children have brothers and sisters, making it possible to adopt more than one child and creating an instant family. All of these children need the love and security of a family of their own."
There are no rigid guidelines regarding family income, home ownership, age, marital status or experience with children. Financial help is available for some of the older children, and all of their medical and counseling services are funded through state programs.
There is no lengthy waiting list and no fees associated with the adoption of older children.
"The qualities a family needs to adopt an older child include love for children and a lifestyle which would promote the child's educational, social and medical needs," McGinnis said.
