Teen debuts with Lyric Opera

Jennifer Dautermann, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. David Dautermann of Farmington Hills, makes her debut with Michigan Lyric Opera in the role of Barbarina in "The Marriage of Figaro."

Mozart's comic opera will be sung in English for performances at 8 p.m. Friday and Saturday, and at 2:30 p.m. Sunday in Marquis Theater, 135 E. Main, Northville.

"This is a very precocious young lady," said Julie Frentrup, speaking for the opera company. "She is only 17 years old and has the repertoire and polish of an accomplished singer. She is a self-assured teen who will certainly succeed as a professional opera singer."

Dautermann, who graduated from Harrison High School last week, has won vocal scholarships from Madrigal Chorus of Southfield in 1985, 1986 and 1987, and performed regularly with the chorus.

She has attended Interlochen National Music Camp, on scholarship, played the role of Lady Psyche in its production of Gilbert and Sullivan's "Princess Ida" and will enter Interlochen Academy this fall.

"The costumes will be sumptuous," Frentrup said of the production. "They were obtained from Malabar of Toronto, probably the finest costume company in North America. They will be matched in splendor by a set with palatial arches 20 feet high and a garden of roses."

Frentrup gives credit for the enhancement of the production to Michigan Council for the Arts, increased visibility and audience support.

Conductor for the opera is Douglas Morrison. It is directed by Arthur Rizzo.

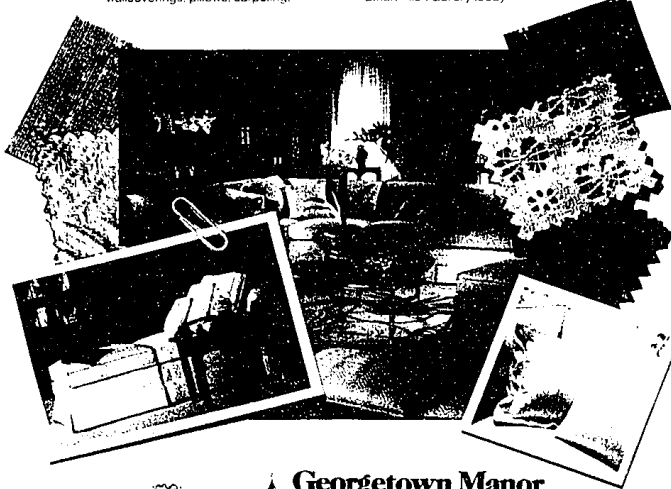
